MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE METROPOLITAN SCHOOL DISTRICT OF NORTH POSEY COUNTY INDIANA, HELD: May 8, 1961

The Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana, met in regular session on the 8th day of May, 1961, at the hour of 7:20 P.M., in the office of the Superintendent of Schools, with Members Kemmerling, Meredith, Williams, Lowe and Heckman present, as well as Superintendent Hollen and Attorney Schuler.

The minutes of the meeting of April 24, 1961, were read, amended to insert the words "Mr. Cousert" after the word "Seargeant" in lines #7 and # 13 of the paragraph entitled "Junior-Senior Personnel", and approved as read and amended.

Claims #713 through #756, together with the payroll vouchers were presented to the Board for consideration, and on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, were approved, signed and ordered paid.

LETTER OF RESIGNATIONS:--submitted by teachers of the Metropolitan School District, effective at the end of the L960-61 contract year, were read to the Board of Education for approval. After motion duly made and seconded and unanimously carried the Board accepted the resignations of the following teachers as written: Ted Anson, Patricia Bell, Orin Bowman, Otis Cousert, Madeline Harmon, Glen Redman, Jack Seargeant, Dale Tenison, and J.D. Foster.

TRANSFER RESOLUTION: -- A resolution authorizing the transfer of the balance of \$4159,99 remaining in the Cumulative Building Fund to Special School Fund was presented to the Board, and following discussion, on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, was adopted by the Board. A signed copy of this resolution was ordered placed in the minutes of this meeting by insertion in the minute book, and incorporation by reference as though completely copied herein.

ART WORKSHOP: -- The Superintendent announced that an Art Workshop was to be held in Mt. Vernon on August 22,23, and 24, and that 19 of the elementary teachers had signed to participate, and that there was a possibility that a 20th would participate. The question was raised as to what compensation whould be paid those attending. Thereupon, following a discussion, on motion duly made by Williams, seconded by Meredith and Lowe, and unanimously carried, the Board approved a payment of \$25.00 to each participating teacher who had perfect attendence.

VETERAN"S PROGRAM: -- The Superintendent reported that there were two veterans left participating in this program, and that Mr. Orin Bowman contemplated continuing instructing them until further notice and receiving as compensation that amount which is paid to the district by the Veteran.

NON-INSTRUCTIONAL SALARIES: -- The Board considered the fixing of salaries for non-instructional personnel, consisting of sustodians, secretaries-clerks, and the School Nurse and Maintenance Superintendent.

- (a) Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried the Board voted a \$15.00 per month pay increase for the six custodians, effective 7/1/61.
- (b) Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Board voted a monthly increase of \$15.00 for Mrs. Heim and a monthly increase of \$10.00 for each of the other four secretary-clerks, effective 7/1/61.
- (c) Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried the Board voted a salary for Mrs. Wade, the school nurse, for the school year 1961-1962, of \$4,200.00 together with \$540.00 as a travel allowance.
- (d) Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Board voted as a salary increas of \$35.00 per month for Maintenance Superintendent Rogers, commencing 7/1/61.

HEAD BASKETBALL COACH: -- The Board screened several applications, and held an interview with Mr. Melvin Lurker, an applicant, and after due consideration in executive session, on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board voted to offer Mr. Lurker a contract as Head Basketball Coach, Head Track Coach, and Assistant football Coach, with teaching duties, for a period of 2 years, with the salary for the initial year fixed at \$5,500.00.

SUMMER PROGRAM: -- The Summer Program was again reviewed by the Board, and on motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, adopted as presented, with the salaries for those conducting the program fixed as follows:

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE METROPOLITAN SCHOOL DISTRICT OF NORTH POSEY COUNTY, INDIANA -- HELD May 22, 1961

The Board of Education of the Metropolitan School District of North Posey County, Indiana, met in regular session on the 22nd day of May, 1961, at the hour of 7:30 o'clock,, P. M. in the office of the Superintendent of Schools with members Meredith, Heckerman, Kemmerling, Lowe, and Williams present, as well as Superintendent Hollen, Maintenance Superintendent Rogers and Attorney Schuler.

The meeting was called to order by President Heckerman, and the minutes of the meeting of May 8, 1961, were read and approved.

Bus Driver John Goedde met with the Board to submit his voluntary resignation as one of the District Drivers, and upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, said resignation was accepted.

Payroll vouchers and claims #757 through #780 were presented to the Board, and after reading, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the same were approved, signed, and ordered paid.

The Superintendent submitted to the Board an Instructional Salary Report, and with said report explained to the Board the financial picture in the tuition fund, and gave a breakdown of the exact appropriation and exact expenditures for the remainder of the year.

The Superintendent then reported to the Board on the need for certain additional appropriations, as had been discussed during previous Board meetings, and suggested to the Board the following increases:

Following a discussion, upon motion duly made by Williams, Seconded by Kemmerling and unanimously carried, the Board authorized the Superintendent to cause the notices to be prepared and the necessary advertising made, with hearing to be had on June 5, 1961.

On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the contracts for #2 fuel at South Terrace, #5 fuel at the Highschool and for gasoline were awarded to Standard Oil, through Vic Goldbach, Agent; the contract for #2 feel at the Highschool was awarded to Cox Oil Co., Inc., and the contract for coal at the several schools to West Coal and Lime.

The superintendent reported that Peyronnin had apparently corrected the various leaks in the school buildings, and that sanding of the gym floor at the High School was to begin on May 29th.

A letter was received by the Superintendent and presented to the Board from the State Department of Education, certifying that Mr. J. D. Foster was entitled to receive an additional \$300.00 for night work done with youths and adults and FFA. The Superintendent and attorney were of the opinion that this would be payable upon receipt of the reimbursement money from the state. On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the \$300.00 was ordered paid when available.

Mr. Rogers reported on the need for certain terracing on the West side of the S. Temace School to take care of surface water which tended to run close to the building and over thee d septic tank field bed system. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board authorized Mr. Rogers to proceed with the work on the terracing.

Mr. Hollen presented to the Board the request of Mrs. Gilmore that she be paid the balance of her contract at this time as she was in need of the money for summer education. On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Board granted this request and authorized the Superintendent to prepare the necessary check.

Mr. Hutchinson reported that he recommended the hiring of Mrs. Ruby Fleener, Cynthiana, as the fifth cook, at a salary of \$7.00 per day. On motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, this recommendation was adopted and Mrs. Fleener hired.

There being no further business to come before the Board, on motion/duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting adjourned at 11:05.
